

2015 Is Another Great Year for Sioux Falls

- Infrastructure/road improvements can't go much better.
- Our Events Center is operating in the black.
- Unprecedented indoor aquatic center title sponsorship.
 Construction is on track.
- Preliminary flood insurance rate maps—we're almost there!
- Fire Station 11 serving northwest Sioux Falls.
- 3,000 available jobs.



Another Record-Breaking Year for Construction



Reached a Major Milestone With Rail Yard Redevelopment Project

- The City of Sioux Falls and BNSF have agreed to a purchase price of \$27,334,500.
- Provides more than ten acres of property for redevelopment.
- Timeline:
 - Close within eight months of executed purchase agreement
 - 2016: BNSF begins constructing new siding tracks
 - 2018: Development in downtown can begin








Strong Sales Tax Growth






Construction Is Boosting Property Tax Revenues





Largest Budget in Our History \$471 Million




Projecting \$472 Million in Revenue in 2016

Prudent, Responsible Budgets Are the Rule in This Town

- Unlimited wants and needs
- Limited revenues
- Tough choices must be made



2016 Priorities— More of the Same!

- Take care of what we already have
- Stay one step ahead of growth
- Tackle tough issues
- Capture long-awaited opportunities/needs



Priority #1: Take Care of What We Already Have

- More than 3,000 lane miles of streets (winter and summer)
- 860 miles of sanitary sewer
- 1,000 miles of water mains
- 419 miles of storm sewer
- Hundreds of City buildings and structures
- 78 parks encompassing 3,161 acres



Take Care of Streets and Infrastructure

98% of citizens feel it is an important investment





Investing Heavily in Streets and Infrastructure

- \$53.7M investment in utilities
- \$41.9M investment in roads
- 290 blocks to be repaired in 2016 as part of the Street Rehabilitation Program
- 12th Street Bridge Project
- Technical evaluation of our streets



Will Invest \$2.3 Million to Take Care of Buildings and Equipment

- Maintaining Our Buildings
 - Police outdoor range improvements (capital)
 - Cyclic repair programs
 - Oakview Library roof
 - Caille Library roof and siding

- Updating What We Have
 - Fire training and classroom remodel
 - –Fleet study
 - -Fairgrounds restrooms
 - Caille Library renovation




New FTEs Are Heavily Scrutinized

- Electric rates (2014)




Reviews of Other User Fees Are Long Overdue

- Pool fees—not since 2011


Nothing is getting cheaper.








Transit Rate Has Not Been Adjusted Since 1996 Monthly Pass History




Transit Fares

Operating Expense per Ride = \$28.33 Fare = \$2/ride


Fixed Route Cost Per Ride



Operating Expense per Ride = \$4.43 Fare = \$25/month or \$1/ride



Pool Fees Last Adjusted in 2011



2014 Total Pool Costs: \$1,779,646

- User fees covered only 1/4 the cost of operating expenses of the outdoor pools in 2014.
- Want a good start with our new indoor aquatic center.



Tackle Annexations

- More than 50 properties on the list
- Property owners
 - Benefit from City services
 - -But don't share fairly in the cost of services
- Strong resistance to annexation in some cases
- City may not recoup all infrastructure costs
- This isn't easy



Priority #4: Capture Long-Awaited Opportunities/Needs

Every citizen has his or her own wish list.



Investing Up to \$12 Million in Our Downtown Parking Ramp

- Design and construct a new 600-space public parking structure
- Public/private partnership
- Combination of cash and bond funds





Investing \$10.5 Million in Foundation Park



- Big priority for city and state
- Economic development is often expensive.
- Streets and water main installation 2016–2017
- Sanitary sewer installation 2016–2017



Investing \$4.3 Million in Affordable Housing

- Multifamily projects
- Single-family projects
- Blight removal
- Rental assistance
- Case management





Continued Efforts in Workforce Development

- 2015 Workforce Development Pilot Program
 - -Eight grants awarded to address multiple focus areas
 - Long-term strategic plan accomplished

Investing another \$500,000 in 2016



Improving Efficiency Through Fleet Centralization

- Fleet study completed
- Working on software RFP
- Software implementation in 2016
- Two new positions to facilitate centralization



Police Body Cameras

- Purchasing 12 body cameras
- For motorcycle and bike officers who currently do not have video recording capabilities
